

25 Years of Decentralised Governance in India: Status, Issues and Ways Forward

It is 25 years since historic legislations on decentralised governance were passed by the Indian Parliament. In the last 25 years, public service at the local level are sought to be delivered through decentralised governance, and this may have resulted in good development outcomes in both rural and urban areas. In order to critically examine the progress that decentralised governance made since then and the impact of democratic decentralisation on development outcomes, the Centre for Decentralisation and Development (CDD) at the Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC) is organising an international seminar on “**25 Years of Decentralised Governance in India: Status, Issues and Ways Forward**”.
