Abstract

Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report has concluded that Earth's climate is getting so warmer that temperatures in about a decade will probably go past the warning level. Issuing `code red for humanity', the report outlines the implications for humans all over the planet. In view of the bleak picture painted by the Report on climate change, the Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), Bengaluru, is organising a national webinar to discuss the report in the light of research carried out in the institute. Some of the themes covered in the webinar are i) Climate change: Impact on bio-diversity hotspots; ii) Climate change, agricultural productivity and adaptation at the local level; iii) Household carbon footprints across the regions and across the income groups; iv) Challenges to mobilise financial resources for mitigation of greenhouse gases; V) Challenges to adapt to climate change in different sectors of the economy; vi) implications of rising temperature for vulnerable groups; vii) Carbon emissions, climate change and urbanization; and viii) Coping mechanisms in Peri-Urban Areas.
